Dual Degree Requirements

The MALAS component requires 24 hours of course work. The Law component requires a total of 80 credit hours of Law course work which must include 9 hours of International Law, plus 6 credits of LAS courses that count toward both degrees, and are taken after the student first enrolls in law classes. The student must notify the Law School registrar upon registering for those credits, so that they are counted toward the 86 hours required by the Law School. Finally, the student must take a 3-hour course that bridges Law and Latin American Studies, which is taken for credit in the LAS program, not the law school. This bridge course is taken, in ADDITION to the 24 LAS credits and 80 law credits and helps create connectivity between the two programs.




