## Dr. Luis Iñaki Prádanos

Department Chair and Professor of Hispanic Contemporary Studies in the Department of Spanish and Portuguese | Miami University of Ohio

This talk explores the main issues and gaps within the rapidly emerging field of Spanish Environmental Cultural Studies and proposes the notion of 'post-growth humanities," which envisions a vibrant role for the humanities in the context of mass extinction and planetary limits.

Originally from Spain, Professor Prádanos did his undergraduate work in Spain and Italy, and completed his M.A. and Ph.D. in the US. His academic interests include environmental humanities (environmental cultural studies, energy humanities, ecocritical theory, urban ecology, and critical posthumanism), postgrowth economics and cultures, and permaculture.
