Chilean film maker, journalist, and professor, Hans Mülchi Bremer has been making documentaries for over 25 years. His full length feature films include "Calafate, Zoológicos Humanos," "Alas de Mar," and "Indígenas Notables," a series of feature films for TV. He is currently working on "Lenguaraces", a TV series about Indigenous languages and on his third feature film: "Hitorangi". Hans holds a degree in History and is an associate professor at the Universidad de Chile.
