Doris Loayza is Teaching Assistant Professor at the Latin American and Latinx Studies Center at Colorado University at Boulder, where she teaches Quechua Language and culture, Introduction to Latin American Studies, and Geography of the Andes. Doris grew up in the Peruvian Andes and is a native Quechua and Spanish speaker.



She is also a podcast and documentary producer. Her short documentary "Bronx Llagtamanta," about an Ecuadorian immigrant in NYC who starts Kiwcha radio program, screened at universities, indigenous festivals and the United Nations. She is currently producing a podcast on traditional Andean food for CU Boulder in collaboration with a collective of Quechua speakers in Peru. Doris earned an M.A. in Latin American & Caribbean Studies from NYU, and studied documentary storytelling at the Bronx Documentary Center.
